Local and Sustainable Food **Hubs Add Value for Producers and Community**

We sent a survey to food producers, processors, and distributors involved in local and sustainable food across Ontario, Canada.

We heard back from 125* operations connected to food hubs.

Here's what we learned about what food hubs do for **producers** and for the broader community.

What is a food hub? Food hubs are actual or virtual

spaces that collect and distribute food to processors, retailers, restaurants, and/or consumers.

Food hubs can also provide space for other activities including food preparation, handling, processing, weducation, and/or training.

What do we mean by "sustainable food"?


Sustainable food systems demonstrate varying degrees of economic viability, social justice/equity, and ecological regeneration from seed to plate

Food Hub Services to **Producers**


Food hubs report that the most important services they provide to producers are transport services, educational activities, market growth assistance, and branding/labelling. Commercial kitchens and additional educational activities are top future service opportunities.




Producers report benefiting from food hubs through access to new markets, product diversification, and help with
